Lesson Seven: Peter and the Resurrection

Lesson Aim: To see the restoration of Peter and what new life can do **Lesson Texts:** John 20:1-10; John 21:1-23; Luke 24:50-53; Acts 1:1-26

1. Peter in Between the Crucifixion and the Resurrection

- a. Read John 20:10, 19
- b. How would you describe the heart of Peter during these three days based on what we have studied already?
- c. What light does 1 Peter 1:3 shed on what he might have been feeling?

2. Peter on Resurrection Day

- a. Read John 20:1-10
- b. What surprise does Mary find and what did she do with this information? (also see Mark 16:5-7)
- c. Contrast the difference between the other disciple and Peter regarding the tomb?
- d. See Luke 24:34 and 1 Corinthians 15:5 who received a personal visit by Jesus on this day? Why do you think Jesus made a point to do this?

3. Peter by the Sea of Galilee with Jesus

- a. Read John 21:1-23
- b. Explain why the apostles returned to Galilee. (see Mark 12:48; 16:7)
- c. How many were together?
- d. What were the circumstances under which they saw Jesus?
- e. Who was the first one to recognize Jesus? How did Peter react?

f. What did Jesus do for and with them?
g. What questions did Jesus ask Peter?
h. How did Peter respond to each question?
i. What three things did Jesus tell Peter to do?
j. What kind of death did Jesus predict that Peter would experience?
k. What question did Peter then ask Jesus and what was his reply?
4. Peter and the Ascension of Jesusa. Read Luke 24:50-53 and Acts 1:1-26b. What amount of time has passed since the resurrection?
c. What has Jesus been doing during this time?
d. From what place did Jesus ascend?
e. Where did he tell them to remain, and what were they to wait for?
f. What was the reaction of the apostles when Jesus ascended?
g. What was the message of the angels to them?
h. Where did they stay in Jerusalem and what did they do while they waited?
i. Who led in the selection of a replacement for Judas and how did they do this
